Fr. Salisbury Steak Bites

Growing up my sister absolutely loved to swim. Nothing made her happier in the summer than being able to go to the pool and to spend an entire day there. So one year the family decided to bring all the fun of the pool to her by getting her a rather large above ground pool. I'm pretty sure the pool itself was larger than the state of Rhode Island. We got it filled up and she proceeded to have a great time in her new pool. I wanted to try and make the pool even more amazing by dying it her favorite color, which is green. So I got one of those little bottles of food coloring dye and put some drops in the water, and guess what happened......ABSOLUTLEY NOTHING!! There was so much water that the food coloring stood no chance of changing it. The water simply absorbed the food coloring and completely overwhelmed it. This is an image that can help us understand God's Divine Mercy. Our sins are the food coloring, God's Mercy is the pool. Our sins stand no chance against God's Mercy, provided we immerse our sins in God's Mercy. This may sound unbelievable, but you can add up literally every sin that every human being has ever commit and will ever commit, and they are nothing more than a single drop compared to the infinite ocean of God's Mercy and Forgiveness. Our sins can never overtake or overcome God's Mercy.

Jesus said "Today bring to Me all mankind, especially all sinners and immerse them in the Ocean of My Mercy. In this way you will console Me in the bitter grief into which the loss of souls plunge me." If there have been sins from the past that you have held onto because you have been afraid to confess them, or if you have felt burdened by sins you are currently caring; I would encourage you to immerse yourself in the sacrament of confession and receive God's Mercy. Don't give your sins more power than they have, they are not even a drop compared to God's mercy. God always wants to wash us in His Mercy, but if we do not go to Him and ask for forgiveness we remain closed off to His forgiveness. Do not close yourself off, immerse your sins in the Mercy of God, and allow Him to overwhelm them!
