Fr. Salisbury Steak Bites

Could you ever imagine the word 'as' having such significance and such meaning? Usually in our English language it's just a simple preposition or conjunction, but in the gospel today it is something more than that. When Jesus says today "as the Father loves me, so I have loved you." The word 'as' in not just a simple conjunction but it is speaking to a deeper reality on the level of being. When Jesus says the word 'as' here it could literally translate to "in the exact same way the Father has loved me, I have loved you." This isn't something analogous but, instead something rooted in ontological being. Jesus loves us in the exact same way as the Father loves us. So, part of the reflection this weekend can be, how does the Father love us?

Jesus says this at His Last Supper as He washes His disciples' feet and then goes to His cross where He pours out His entire life for us from the cross so we can be saved even in the midst of everyone mocking and abandoning Him. Jesus shows a love that pours out an unconditional and self-emptying love that isn't withheld from anyone. This is an image of the Father's love, a love that unconditionally pours itself out for us, regardless of any sin or struggle we've had, in order to raise us to new life. This is why in the Church, it's been said the perfect image of the Father is Jesus on the cross. The cross most beautifully shows the image of the Father's unconditional love. Perhaps this week, sit before your favorite crucifix and ask Jesus to show you the Father's love through this perfect image of His love.
